Structured mentoring and practical experience to <u>R</u>etain, <u>Inspire</u>, <u>Support and</u> <u>Enhance</u> (RISE) undergraduate students from ethnically underrepresented groups in the Chemical Sciences.

**Objective**: The RISE programme aims to increase the number of Black students, and those from minority ethnic backgrounds, who are pursuing a degree in in the Chemical Sciences and who are going on to take up leading roles in academia and industry in the future.

**Programme:** The programme will recruit Black students, or those from minority ethnic backgrounds onto a structured scheme, where they will get support, mentorship and practical experience of research and technical roles in the chemical sciences. for reporting purposes. Access to the data set will be confined to a small group within the School of Chemistry, who will be responsible for its subsequent analysis. At no point will the information you provide be shared in a way that would allow you to be personally identified. Any published material will be anonymised. Data shared will only be for groups of at least 10 respondents to ensure anonymity.

We will only process data in line with the General Data Protection Regulation 2018 and the Data Protection Act 2018.

You are entitled to:

- The right to access to your data and receive a copy of it
- The right to restrict or object to processing of your data
- The right to object to any further processing of the information we hold about you (except where it is de-identified)
- The right to have inaccurate information about you corrected or deleted
- The right to receive your data in a portable format and to have it transferred to another data controller
- The right to request deletion of your data
